NEW RECTOR, PRIOR AT SANT' ANSELMO

A new rector and prior were recently named at the Pontifical Athenaeum of Sant Anselmo, Rome.

Father Juan Javier Flores Arcas, O.S.B. Rector

Father Juan Javier Flores Arcas, O.S.B., was elected Rector of the Pontifical Athenaeum of Sant' Anselmo on March 19, 2009, with his election being confirmed by the

Holy See on April 3, 2009. Abbot Primate Notker Wolf, O.S.B. oversaw the process in which Father Juan Javier was elected by his colleagues on the faculty of Sant' Anselmo.



At the time he

enters office on June 24, 2009, Father Juan Javier will be responsible for the three Faculties or academic divisions of Sant' Anselmo; namely, the Faculties of Theology, Philosophy, and Liturgy. Within these three main departments and stemming from their primary fields of endeavor, Sant' Anselmo also offers specialized courses of study in the History of Theology, Monastic Studies, and Philosophy and Mysticism.


Father Juan Javier was born in the city of Linares, in southern Spain, in 1951. He studied at the University of Granada and the Università Complutense in Madrid, receiving degrees in Philosophy and Spanish Literature. He began his monastic life at the Abbey of Santo Domingo di Silos, near Burgos in northern Spain in 1977. Father Juan Javier was ordained to the priesthood in 1983, and received his licentiate in Liturgy in 1988, and his doctorate in Liturgy in 1995, both at Sant' Anselmo. Since 1997 he has been a member of the Faculty at Sant' Anselmo, teaching a variety of courses in the areas of Liturgy and Sacramental Theology. In 2000 Father Juan Javier was elected President of the Pontifical Liturgical Institute—a position he held until 2008—and in 2003 he was further appointed as Professor of Liturgical and Sacramental Theology at Sant' Anselmo. Father Juan Javier served as a consultant to the 2005 Synod of Bishops on the Eucharist, and the 2008 Synod on the Word of God in the Life of the Church.

In addition to his teaching, Father Juan Javier has been active in scholarly writing, publishing numerous books and articles on the subject of the liturgy and the sacraments. He has also taken a prominent role in the administration of

FATHER EPHREM CARR NEW LITURGICAL INSTITUTE LEADER

Father Ephrem Carr, O.S.B., a Benedictine monk of St. Meinrad Archabbey in Indiana, and a long-time member of



the faculty at Sant' Anselmo, was elected President of the Pontifical Liturgical Institute on November 13, 2008. Following approval by Abbot Primate Notker Wolf, O.S.B., Father Ephrem began his four-year term of office in December. The Pontifical Liturgical Institute was established in 1961 by Blessed Pope John XXIII in order to deepen and strengthen the historical and theological study of the

Church's liturgy, which is the heart of its prayer life.

Father Ephrem is eminently qualified to take on this new and great responsibility. He has been a Professor of the Liturgical Institute since 1987, where he teaches courses in Oriental Liturgy, Oriental Monasticism, and Syriac. He further teaches Patristic Greek at the

Augustinianum in Rome, and Early Church History at the Pontifical College of St. Bede. Father Ephrem has published and edited many scholarly articles and books in his thirty-year teaching career, and remains active in academic research and writing. He received his doctorate in Liturgy from Sant' Anselmo in 1978, having already completed a Licentiate in Oriental Studies at the Pontifical Oriental Institute in 1970.

In addition to teaching at Sant' Anselmo and at other Roman academies, Father Ephrem served his own monastic community as an Instructor and later Professor at St.

Meinrad Seminary from 1970 until 1986. He also served as Sub-Prior of St. Meinrad Archabbey from 1978 until 1985. A native of Toledo, Ohio, Father Ephrem entered the monastic community of St. Meinrad in 1962, professing simple vows in 1963. He made his solemn profession of vows in 1966, and was ordained to the priesthood the following year. Having spent many years of his Benedictine life at Sant' Anselmo, Father Ephrem is excited to begin a new chapter of his life of service to the Pontifical Athenaeum of Sant' Anselmo, to the Benedictine Order, and to the universal Church.

PETER KREEFT ON "THE SHOCKING BEAUTY OF JESUS CHRIST"

Dr. Peter Kreeft served as the inaugural speaker for the Saint Benedict Education Foundation's annual lecture. Dr. Kreeft's speech examined the powerful theme of Christianity in an increasingly secular world, including theological aesthetics, considered Beauty as the "third absolute", along with Truth and Goodness. He also

Above, foundation President Father Edward Mazich, O.S.B., greets the author. explained how Jesus himself exemplifies true Beauty, and thus continues to "shock" all those who meet him for the first time.

"Christ changed every human being he ever met," Dr. Kreeft stated. "He changed history, splitting it open like a coconut, and inserting eternity into the split between BC and AD."

Dr. Kreeft spoke about boredom, and the havoc it creates within humanity and the secular world, suggesting that boredom is "one of our major psychological problems today." The antidote to boredom is not pleasure or happiness, but joy, which includes surprise.

"The unsurprising life is not worth living," he continued. "Everything God does is a surprise."

several Benedictine Congregations at the international level, and continues to serve as a consultant to the Congregation for Divine Worship of the Holy See.

Father Elias Lorenzo, O.S.B. Prior

Father Elias Lorenzo, O.S.B., will assume the office of Prior of Sant' Anselmo in September 2009. As such,

he will be responsible for the daily operations of a large and complex international community—home to Benedictines of many nations, cultures, and languages. The Prior is the Abbot Primate's principle assistant in overseeing the growth and health of the Benedictines who live and study in the heart of Rome.



Father Elias is no stranger to leadership positions in Benedictine life: he has been a member of the Benedictine community of Saint Mary's for twenty-five years. He entered the Morristown, New Jersey, monastery in 1984, and was ordained as a priest in 1989. During his time at Saint Mary's Father Elias served in many positions within his community, as well as in the Diocese of Metuchen. Father Elias has been Prior of Saint Mary's Abbey, Director of Monastic Formation, and Director of Liturgy. At the Delbarton School—run by the monks of Saint Mary's—Father Elias served for many years as teacher and chairman in the religious studies department, as the director of campus ministry, and as the Vice-President of Delbarton for External Affairs. He also serves at present as the Vicar for Religious of the Diocese of Metuchen.

Father Elias holds degrees in Psychology, Liturgical Studies, and Canon Law. In addition to his responsibilities as the Prior—the superior—of the College of Sant' Anselmo, Father Elias will serve as the Abbot Primate's canonical consultant on affairs involving the Benedictine Order and the Holy See.

His canonical work on behalf of the Church in the United States in recent years has brought Father Elias recognition as one who is deeply committed to the long-term strength and vibrancy of the Church, and the care of all of its members, especially those who are the most vulnerable. To this end, he has served as canonical counsel for Praesidium, Inc., certifying the performance of American dioceses in

protecting the rights and safety of children in the Church.

Father Elias is an experienced hand in Benedictine affairs at the international level: he was a founding member of the International Commission on Benedictine Education, and continues to be involved in matters related to the Commission as well as to other international charitable initiatives.

SISTER JUDITH ANN HEBLE, O.S.B. JOINS FOUNDATION BOARD

Sister Judith Ann Heble, OSB, Prioress of Sacred Heart Monastery in Lisle, Illinois, has been named to the Board of Directors of the Saint Benedict Education Foundation, which supports the international Benedictine university in Rome, Sant'Anselmo. Prioress of her community since

1993, she has also been serving as the Moderator of the Communio Internationalis Benedictinarum (CIB) for the past three years. She has been active in this international conference of Benedictine Women for the past twelve years. She likewise serves on the honorary advisory board of The Beit Benedict Foundation.



Sister Judith Ann is the past President of the Conference of Benedictine Prioresses, having served in that capacity for twelve years.

Since 1995, Sister Judith Ann has been a Trustee at Benedictine University in Lisle, Illinois. She is an ex-officio member of the Board of Directors of Villa St. Benedict, Lisle, Illinois since 1993, a continuing care retirement community on the campus of Sacred Heart Monastery. Since 1992, she has served on the Board of Conciliation and Arbitration for the Diocese for Joliet.

A teacher by profession, she taught elementary school for eleven years, served as Director of Adult and Religious Education for twenty-two years at Saint Joan of Arc, a local parish in Lisle, Illinois. She was also a part-time instructor of Scripture at Benedictine University.

Sister Judith Ann earned a Bachelor of Science degree in History from the College of Saint Francis, Joliet, Illinois; Master of Education Administration, (K-12) from Loyola University, Chicago; and a Master of Theological Studies in Scripture from the Catholic Theological Union, Chicago. She did post-graduate study in Scripture in Israel for a semester.

Three chairs of theology and one scholarship have been established to support studies at Sant' Anselmo.


Each has a goal of two
